# 2020 UCAT ANZ UNIVERSITY CLINICAL APTITUDE TEST

## WHAT'S IN THE TEST?

The UCAT ANZ test is a 2-hour, multiple choice, computer-based test. It consists of five separately timed subtests which assess a range of abilities identified by university medical and dental schools as important.

VERBAL REASONING  
DECISION MAKING  
QUANTITATIVE REASONING  
ABSTRACT REASONING  
SITUATIONAL JUDGEMENT TEST

## ELIGIBILITY

The test is available to any candidate whose educational level at the time of sitting the test is their final year of secondary schooling, or higher.

Candidates registering for the 2020 test should have already completed, or plan to COMPLETE their final year of secondary schooling in 2020 (i.e. Year 12 in Australia; Year 13 in New Zealand).

Students whose current educational level is Australian Year 11 or lower are NOT eligible to sit the test.

## HOW DO I BOOK A TEST?

The test is delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout Australia and New Zealand, and at some overseas locations.

Visit the UCAT ANZ website to book your test by 11 May 2020 at 11:59pm AEST. Late bookings close on 18 May at 11:59pm AEST and incur an additional late fee. No further bookings are accepted after the late booking deadline.

Note that you can only sit the test once a year.

You are required to show one form of photo identification at the test centre from the list below:

- **Passport**
- **Driver's Licence** (*only accepted at test centres in country of issue*)
- **Australian Keypass Card / Under 18 Keypass**
- **Australian Proof of Age Card**
- **New Zealand 18+ Card / Kiwi Access Card**

*Photocopies, photos and digital forms of ID are not accepted. No other form of identification is accepted, including Student ID cards.*
